### Professor Pamela Samuelson, University of California at Berkeley



Pamela Samuelson, Richard M Sherman Distinguished Professor of Law, is recognized as a pioneer in digital copyright law, intellectual property and information policy. Samuelson is also director of the internationally renowned Berkeley Center for Law & Technology. She serves on the board of directors of the Electronic Frontier Foundation and on the board of directors of the Open Source Application Foundation. Samuelson has written and published extensively in the areas of copyright, software protection and cyberlaw.

### Professor Bernt Hugenholtz, University of Amsterdam



Professor of Intellectual Property Law and Director of the Institute for Information Law of the University of Amsterdam (IVIIR), currently associated with University of Bergen. He has written numerous books, studies and articles on a variety of topics involving copyright, information technology, new media and the Internet. Prof. Hugenholtz is a member of the Dutch Copyright Committee, and has acted as a consultant to the World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO), the European Commission, and several national governments.
